On September 1st, 1665.

Inventory taken of the effects of Mr Gysbert Van Imbroch in the presence of the hon. Heer Willem Beeckman, Schout, Jan Willemsen Hoochteylingh and Jan Joosten, deacons at Wildwyck, having been requested to do so by the aforesaid Gysbert Van Imbroch during his life.

Two beds.

Two head pillows.

Four cushions.

One child's bed.

Two new green blankets, belonging to Willem Montagnie.

Three green worn out blankets.

Three white blankets.

Two curtains with a top piece (valletje) on the bed stead.

One bed stead (ledecant) half surrounded by curtains.

In an old chest.

Two pieces of black cloth, together 4 ells.

one "ninocent" of black cloth.

One pair of trousers, made of black cloth.

One man's suit of clothes, made of gray cloth.

One leather coat, with silver and gold bands.

A black turkish coarse grained (grof greyne) man's suit of clothes.

An old suit of clothes made of black cloth. (man's).

A pair of half worn black silk man's stockings.

An orange colored sarsent sanative girdle. (orangie armosyne gesond leyt).

A cloak made of black cloth.

A cloak made of grey cloth.

Five silver spoons.

One silver head dress found in a green box:

One silver thimble.

Two pieces of silver and gold ribbon.

One piece of blue silk ribbon.

One little child's chain (Kinderkettingje) of braided black and white seewan,

in a small white box, inside the little green box.
